create like nobody's listening. There's always somebody listening on the road. You always have company," Zella says, proving she's less like the typical music-scene millennial and more like an old soul who appreciates the smaller things in life.

These days, she's living with fellow recording artist Garrett Borns (aka Børns) in Silver Lake, California. "Imoved here because Ineeded to be closer to the music, and ever since then everything has changed on pace for the better," Zella says, sounding prepared for a fast track that's nothing short of inevitable. With

her strong sense of envy-inducing style and indie-infused pop anthems, she is sure to secure a place of heavy rotation on all of your future playlists.—M.L.
