Queen Biopic *Bohemian Rhapsody* Soundtrack Detailed

Beloved hits, rare live recordings, and a new recording from Smile, the band that preceded Queen



The long-awaited <u>Queen</u> biopic <u>Bohemian Rhapsody</u> is set to hit theaters next month. Today—on what would have been Freddie Mercury's 72nd birthday—the original soundtrack has been detailed. It arrives October 19 via Virgin, and will include rare live recordings in addition to the original studio recordings of beloved hits such as "Killer Queen" and "Somebody to Love." The <u>full tracklist</u> features multiple audio recordings from Queen's iconic Live Aid concert in 1985, previously only released in video form.

Another notable inclusion is a new recording of "Doing All Right," tracked by Brian May and Roger Taylor with vocalist Tin Staffell. Staffell sang in Smile, a band with May and Taylor that preceded Queen. The trio reunited to track the new version at Abbey Road, with all three of the members singing lead vocals. *Bohemian Rhapsody* stars Rami Malik in the role of Freddie; it's out October 24.
