Rowan Blanchard and Sabrina Carpenter on Sneakers, Sisterhood, and Dressing Without Rules



Rowan Blanchard and Sabrina Carpenter are more than just starlets. With their distinctive style and commitment to activism, the actresses have made an impression since they arrived on the scene as the stars of 2014's Disney hit *Girl Meets World*. Intelligent, politically active, and inclined to use their platforms for social justice, both women have secured places among Young Hollywood's most influential. Since the show's finale last year, they have headed in slightly different directions. Carpenter is moving toward music with the release of her second album, *Evolution*. Blanchard, meanwhile, is pursuing a film career, including a supporting role in Ava DuVernay's upcoming adaptation of *A Wrinkle in Time*. As part of Converse's newly launched Forever Chuck campaign, Blanchard and Carpenter join a bevy of Gen-Z tastemakers, including <u>dancer-turned-Gucci model</u> <u>Alton Mason, *Riverdale* actor Cole Sprouse</u>, body-positive model Paloma Elsesser, and rising star Selah Marley in the ads launched on the brand's new <u>Converse</u> <u>Style Instagram</u>. Though they were shot separately, Blanchard and Carpenter say the roots of their personal style are very intertwined. "When we were doing *Girl*, we grew up and discovered [our] style together," Blanchard said on the phone from California. Comparing the experience to high school, Blanchard remembers their days of coordinating fondly. "We would plan out our outfits for the next day on set and were definitely very into each other's style. You want to look cool, and you are really inspired by what your friends are wearing. Sabrina and I were each other's references for that."

Long past the days of dressing alike, Carpenter and Blanchard can still find points of commonality. Both are lovers of vintage shopping, '90s style, and, of course, Converse. And both are united by a willingness to use fashion as a form of expression. "We've almost traveled different paths since the show ended, but to meet up in a place that we both can relate to and identify with is cool," said Carpenter. "I was just looking at Rowan's pictures that came out and she looks amazing. I love that we both can relate and identify with this brand and everything that it stands for."
