



Exclusive: Temecula Road Premieres Emotional New Video For "Everything Without You"

After releasing their latest single, "Everything Without You" last month, country's hottest rising trio, Temecula Road—comprised of sisters Emma and Maddie Salute and Dawson Anderson—is giving *One Country* readers an exclusive look at their brand new video.

The video, directed by Kyle Cogan, features the real-life love story of Lisa and Adam Franco, a retired Marine, who was deployed while Lisa was 5 months pregnant. Missing the birth of his son, Adam relied on photos, videos and texts—which are used throughout the video—to see his newborn baby.
